



Year 3 Curriculum Information Summer Term 2019

English

In English, we will be reading 'The Jolley-Rogers and the Cave of Doom' by Jonny Duddle. In our writing, we are trying to use apostrophes for possession and recognise that we are using subordinate clauses and that we can sometimes begin our sentences with them. We will revisit using inverted commas for direct speech. In guided reading, we will also read 'There's a Pharaoh in our Bath'. We will continue to practise inferring characters' feelings based on their actions and speech.

PSHCE

We will discuss and explore different social situations and consider how people can feel differently in those contexts.

Science

The children will study different plants, looking at what they need to grow, seed dispersal and why plants need leaves. They will make observations and make recordings by drawing measuring.

History/Geography

The children will study the Egyptians and find out about where they lived and why they chose to live there. They will look at why the Nile was and is such an important part of the land. We will also look at artefacts and make conclusions about what they were used for.

PE

During the first half term the children will take part in cricket coaching and athletics. They will continue athletics in the second half term including a variety of athletics activities, such hurdles, relays and javelin. This will be taught alongside rounders.

Maths

We will be revisiting 3, 4 and 8 times-tables. During the term, we will look at equivalent fractions and fractions of amounts. In measure, we will explore time and capacity. We will also be looking and geometry of shapes.

Computing

We will look at the computer software 'Scratch' and use it to make sequences and look for patterns.

RE

The children will be looking at what a community means. We will explore a Christian community and compare our school community with others.

Art and Design

Linking with our history topic, we will explore Egyptian Art and create an Egyptian tote bags in D&T and Canopic jars in Art.

Music

In Music, we will be continuing to learn to read musical notation using glockenspiels to play a variety of songs.
