Dear Parents/Carers

We are delighted to be able to share with you our 2015, Key Stage 2, SATs results. We now know how well our Year 6 children attained in comparison to other children nationally as these figures have recently been shared with us. We also now know how good their progress, measured since Key Stage 1 (Year 2) SATs, has been.

27 Year 6 children took their tests in Reading, Maths and Spelling and Grammar (ESG). Year 6 children do not take a Writing test. Writing is assessed by teachers and these judgements are moderated and validated by Local Authority Assessors.

Significantly High Attainment

Attainment in Reading, Writing, Maths and ESG in 2015 was significantly higher than National attainment in 17 out of 18 areas.

Attainment in combined Reading, Writing and Maths was significantly higher, at Level 4+, Level 4b+ and at Level 5+, than National combined attainment.

Significantly High Progress

Percentages of our Year 6 pupils making 2 levels progress (expected progress) were higher than National percentages in Reading, in Writing and in Maths.

Percentages of our Year 6 pupils making 3 levels progress (better than expected progress) were higher than National percentages in Reading and in Maths and broadly in line in Writing. Progress in Writing has vastly improved since 2014.

Congratulations to all our Year 6 children from last Year. Your exceptionally hard work definitely paid off.

Our current Year 6 children are making excellent progress towards their Age Related Expectations and we are confident 2016 we will be another good year in line with 2015.
