Mathematics

To learn number rhymes e.g. 5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer and 10 Fat Sausages.

To count reliably to 10 and beyond.

To say and use number names accurately in play.

To count objects by saying one number for each item.

To begin to recognise numerals 0-9 and beyond.

To match numerals to sets of objects. Become familiar with the language of 2D and 3D shapes and use shapes to make pictures.

To begin to understand repetition in pattern.

Literacy

To join in with rhymes and stories.

To be able to talk about story structure and content.

To be able to recognise their own name.

To begin to learn letter sounds.

To begin to develop oral blending and segmenting of sounds in words.

Understanding the World

To share information about themselves through show and tell and circle time.
