Mathematics

Introduce 3D shapes

Use mathematical language to describe 2D and 3D shapes.

To say 1 more and 1 less than a given number within 10 and beyond.

Count random arrays of objects up to 10.

To be able to estimate how many objects there are in a set.

Begin to solve simple addition and subtraction problems using practical equipment.

Use scales to compare and weigh objects.

Literacy

To become familiar with the structure and content of non-fiction texts and to use such books to find out facts. Learn phase 3 sounds and tricky words.
