

Communication and Language

Engage with 'surprise box' – asking and answering questions plus giving clues

Listen to listen to stories including Flapjack and Waddle, The Emperor's Egg, Cuddly Duddly, Pete the Penguin, Be Brave Little Penguin, Snow Bears and The Great Explorer.

Join in with conversations, knowing when to speak and when to listen.

To ask relevant questions of others.

Listen to conversations and respond appropriately.

To listen to, and ask questions about, non-fiction books.

Physical Development

For children to be able to fasten their own zips.

Arctic animal yoga.

To be able to safely transport and store PE and outdoor equipment.

Use scissors confidently with control to cut a variety of shapes, including snowflakes

Personal, Social Emotional Development

For children to resolve their own conflicts through learning to discuss and choose solutions

Share stories about feelings.

Spring Term 1

This half term our topic is: The Polar Regions



Mathematics

Recognise and order numbers to 10 then beyond.

Simple addition – combine two groups to find the total.

Explore making numbers up to 5.

2D and 3D shapes.

Weigh objects and compare the weight of objects.

Literacy

To become familiar with the structure and content of non-fiction texts and to use such books to find out facts.

Learn phase 3 sounds and tricky words.

Apply knowledge of sounds and tricky words to write words, captions and simple sentences to write about Arctic and Antarctic animals.

Work together to orally create stories.

Understanding the World

Identify features of Arctic and Antarctic and find out about the animals that live there

Discuss and compare hot and cold climates

To explore water and ice

- To begin to understand the process of freezing and thawing
- To experiment with different ways of retrieving objects from ice
