<u>Shotley Bridge Primary School Sports Premium Statement 2021-2022</u> (Including impact of 2020- 2021 strategy.)

Impact of Sports Premium Funding 2020-2021

This summary includes the impact of Sports Premium Funding including when schools closed due to Covid Pandemic. A significant amount of Sports Premium Spending activity took when schools reopened.

Due to the pandemic, the children of Shotley Bridge Primary have had fewer opportunities than planned. However, the impact of the 2020-2021 has been:

- The Year 5/6 boys football team have won the Derwentside league.
- KS1 have competed in their first football taster league.
- The Year 5/6 girls football team have played their first season and are finding regular success.
- The Year 6 Tag Rugby team placed 3rd in the Derwentside schools cup.
- Clubs such as: street dance, multi-skills, invasion games and football training have been provided for the children to give them experience of different sports and skills. Each of these clubs has been at capacity with archery, fencing and gymnastics planned for the future.
- Each class has been to a sporting event with SLP to either compete or to take part in a festival and showcase their skills.
- KS1 went to a dance festival where they performed in front of other schools.
- We have planned the first inter-house team competitions within school. Through these competitions, all children will participate in competitive sport.
- A group of children in Year 5/6 are scheduled to receive specialist training from a trusted coaching provider on how to lead sport across the school. These children will then run games at lunch time and facilitate the inter-house competitions.
- The whole school participated in Skip Into Spring where they learned a wide variety of skipping skills.
- The whole school took part in HoopStarz workshops where they learned how to hula hoop. The children learned lots of skills and tricks.

In 2021-2022, the school will receive an estimated £19,750 on school P.E. and sport. Outlined below is how we anticipate to use this particular funding. The reader needs to be aware that there is a huge amount of additional activity taking place that is not covered in the narrow scope of this document. Costs are estimate only.
