<u>Shotley Bridge Primary School Sports Premium Statement 2022-2023</u> (Including impact of 2021- 2022 strategy.)

Impact of Sports Premium Funding 2021-2022

This summary includes the impact of Sports Premium Funding for 2021-2022 academic year.

Due to the continuing effects of the pandemic, the children of Shotley Bridge Primary have continued to have fewer opportunities than intended.

The impact of the 2021-2022 sports premium has been:

- The Year 5/6 boys football team have again won the Derwentside league.
- KS1 have continued to compete in intraschool sports.
- The Year 5/6 girls football team have continued their success in their second season.
- The Year 6 Tag Rugby team finished in a podium position again in the Derwentside school cup.
- Clubs such as: street dance, multi-skills, invasion games and football training have continued to provide the children with an experience of different sports and skills. Each of these clubs has been at capacity with regular rotation of children to ensure inclusion.
- Each class has been to a sporting event with SLP to either compete or take part in a festival to showcase their skills.
- Continued interschool competitions to allow all children more chance to compete against each other.
- A group of children in Year 5 are scheduled to receive specialist training from a trusted coaching provider on how to lead sport across the school. These children will then run games at lunch time and facilitate the inter-house competitions.
- The whole school participated in a fun run to raise money for Children in Need.
- Initiated a SLA with a sports provider to deliver high quality PE lessons across school.
- Children took part in Chance to Shine cricket sessions and a lot of SBPS joined SBPSCC (approximately 80)
- Gold Sports Mark target was achieved.
- 100% of classes attended a sporting event outside of school.
- Positive feedback received from all children who took part in pupil voice for PE.

- Staff are pleased with progression and coverage provided by chosen PE scheme.
- Staff are pleased with the PE sessions that the coaches are delivering on a weekly basis.
- 48% of children attended an after-school sports club
- 87% of children across school are on track for ARE in PE.

In 2022-2023, the school will receive an estimated £19,750 on school P.E. and sport. Outlined below is how we anticipate using this funding. The reader should be aware that there is a huge amount of additional activity taking place that is not covered in the narrow scope of this document. Costs are estimate only.
