# <u>Shotley Bridge Primary School Sports Premium Statement 2023-2024</u> (Including impact of 2022- 2023 strategy.)

#### **Impact of Sports Premium Funding 2022-2023**

Below is a summary of the impact of spending from 2022-2023.

- Clubs have run throughout the year offering a wide range of sporting opportunities for the children on SBPS.
- KS2 have continued to compete in interschool sports.
- All KS1 and KS2 children have participated in intraschool sports as part of SSP agreement.
- The Year 5/6 girls football team have continued their success as part of our SSP.
- Clubs such as: dance, multi-skills, invasion games and football training have continued to provide the children with an experience of different sports and skills. Each of these clubs has been at capacity with regular rotation of children to ensure inclusion.
- PP pupils have clubs free of charge.
- Lunch time clubs have been set up at KS1 and KS2 and children are now more active during this time.
- The whole school participated in Children In Need Fun Run.
- Sustained use of coaches to deliver high quality lessons of PE across the school.
- School was accredited another Sports Mark due to physical educational offer in school.
- Positive feedback from all 14 children asked about PE in pupil voice.
- Staff pleased with current PE scheme and the sessions that the coaches are delivering.
- Staff participated in training to enhance their PE subject knowledge
- 53% of children attended an after-school sports club
- Children in Year 5 had playtime leader training and they can now run play time games
- Children who participated in interschool competitions all received a medal and trophies were awarded to the winners

In 2023-2024, the school will receive an estimated £19,750 on school P.E. and sport. Outlined below is how we anticipate using this funding. The reader needs to be aware that there is a huge amount of additional activity taking place that is not covered in the narrow scope of this document. Costs are estimate only.
